



How is this funded? 25/26

The Government award ‘Pupil Premium’ funding to all eligible children.

This funding is currently £1,515 per pupil per year.

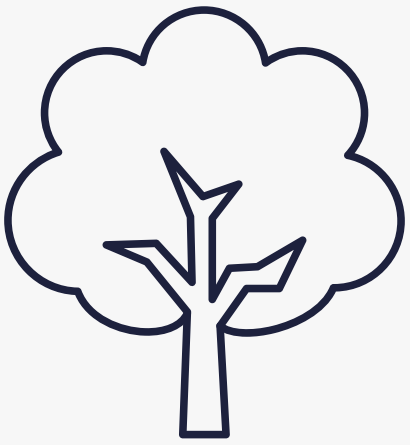
It is the school decision on how they use this funding. At St.Peter’s CofE Academy the money will be spent on funding the initiatives mentioned overleaf for children eligible.

Other money may be spent of supporting ALL children through the provision of additional support staff, paying for visitors to enhance the curriculum and staff training etc.

Full details of how the school spent last year’s PP funding is on the school website, or can be requested from the school office.



Please note, if the Government funding of ‘Pupil Premium’ changes, the school reserves the right to change it’s offer. Provision is directly related to the current funding arrangements.

Would you like to save money and help your child and the school?

- Help with funding for resources to support your child.
- Support to help your child make age related progress in the curriculum
- Funding towards musical instruments tuition in school
- Contribution towards school curriculum trips/visits.

Is my child eligible?

If you are in receipt of the Universal Credit, you will be able to apply for 'Free School Meals' which then automatically registers your child as 'Pupil Premium'.

All children in Reception and Year 1/2 are currently entitled to a 'free' school lunch funded by the Government. This is different to Free School Meals and you must apply for FSM to receive the PP benefits listed.

Children in receipt of FSM do not need to take the 'free' lunch if they would prefer to bring their own packed lunch.

Is my child eligible?

If your children are 'looked after', adopted, living with you in special guardianship or have ever been in care, or a current or past service (armed forces) child.

Funding of up to £2,630 is available. Apply online.

'Ever 6'

Please note: If your circumstances change, and you no longer receive FSM, your child will still have Pupil Premium status and be eligible for some of the savings listed. If you have received FSM in the past, please contact the office as you may still be eligible for PP/ This is known as 'Ever 6'. As the title suggests, the school will receive the PP funding even though your circumstances may have changed.

Music Lessons:

At times, instrumental music lessons can be offered. Lately, children have benefitted from drumming tuition. All children are then invited to perform to their peers.

School Trips:

A contribution towards school trips/visits when these are linked to curriculum learning.

Residential:

Funding might be used for Year residential visits.

School Clubs:

Contribution towards after school clubs.

Education:

Your child may also benefit from 1:1 tuition or small group work if this is deemed as needed to help your child make age related progress.

Other:

Mr Tomlinson will always welcome a discussion if you require funding towards other items that allow your child to attend and enjoy school.
