It was lovely to see so many of you at our 'meet and greet' gathering on Wednesday. Hopefully you were able to find this meeting useful. I cannot believe how busy we have been! It has been a great start to the term and all your children have settled into new routines beautifully. They should feel exceptionally proud of themselves as they have worked hard to settle in and do the right thing all the time.

Every child in my class now has a special job (they may have told you about this) Class jobs are changed regularly every half term which means that over the school year, each child will experience up to six different roles of responsibility.

By now, your child should have their new school diary for this year with a label on the front cover displaying their home reading book change day. (See below for further information about reading) Please feel free to fill in the pages inside the diary that require information or signatures. I have talked to the children about the 'prayer' pages and explained that these are private to them unless they choose to share them with me or others. On occasions, we may write a prayer at school, but the children may add to them at home if they wish to. I know that many children chose to do this last weekend after we discussed how we felt about the passing away of our wonderful Queen. Many children chose to share their prayers with me, and I was highly impressed!

Our main driver topic for the <u>whole term</u> is 'Childhood' It is history based and focuses on many aspects of childhood experiences past and present. We will be setting a creative homework task based on this topic after half term for children to complete at home. Alongside this, art, geography, science, design and technology, music, IT and P.E. will be taught as half termly units.

Today we have enjoyed learning some tennis skills with Nick. This session will be outside every Friday. As the weather may turn colder, the children may need a warm hoody for this lesson and long jogging bottoms or leggings.

It would be useful if you could send on old, oversized shirt or t-shirt into school for painting and craft sessions. The shirt would remain in school all year and returned next July! A name inside the shirt would also be very helpful. These can be sent in at any point — I do have a few aprons in the classroom but not enough for everyone.

## Maths:

In maths over the last couple of weeks we have spent some time learning how to set out work properly in our maths books now that we are in Year 2! The children have also completed a range of activities involving number tracks and writing numerals as words. We have now started our unit of work on place value, and this will develop over the next few weeks.

## English:

The children have enjoyed writing about themselves and their holiday adventures recently. We have also spent time focusing on letter formation and handwriting in our Year 2 writing books, taking care to keep our letters within the guidelines of the page. Next week, we will begin work on our first text 'Where the Wild Things Are' by Maurice Sendak.

All Year 2 children were given their first list of weekly spellings or phonic related words to learn at home today. This can be found in the spelling pages of your child's diary. If your child is now through their phonic screening and are on the spelling programme, you will also be provided with a master copy of all lists (and Year 2 key words) for this half term with an explanation of how this will work. These can also be found on my class page of the school website.

## Reading:

Please aim to read with your child at least three times a week and sign it in the diary pages of their planner. I am quite happy for children to record their own home reading into their diary under your supervision if this is easier. I will be starting to check diaries every Friday starting on Friday 23rd September where I will award stickers and house points as a reward for regular reading. I am trying to gauge an appropriate number of weekly books to give your child based on how keen they are to read! If books need changing in between book change days, your child will need to let me know and I can organise an extra book.

## Additional Information:

- Show and tell began today and this will continue every Friday. All children will get their turn, but this will be <u>by invitation</u>. I have spoken to my class about how this will work all will be explained when their invite is drawn out of the hat!
- This year, Moonbeam the bear (cousin of Sunbeam) is looking forward to spending a weekend with
  each child over the year. If your child is chosen as 'Star of the Week' they will bring Moonbeam
  home with them on a Friday. A book is provided to write about the adventures that your child gets

up to with the bear. Once Moonbeam is returned to school on the following Monday, your child will be given the opportunity to share their experience with the rest of the class. This is a great opportunity for your child to gain confidence by speaking in front of an audience.

- P.E. Children will require an indoor kit for Tuesday sessions and an outdoor kit for Friday mornings.
