Thank you for supporting your child with the recent homework task - the children have written some super acrostic poems about autumn and harvest.

Our fantastic Nottingham homework is now proudly on display in our classroom. Our walls are now complete, with examples of work everywhere - the children are very proud. We have worked hard this week making divas and re-telling the story of Rama and Sita to celebrate Diwali. Your child should be able to tell you about this. In I.T. the children have logged onto Oddizzi to familiarize themselves with the wealth of geography based resources available to them. If you wish to use this at home, their username and password is the same. For our class it is singers.

In maths this week, Year 1 children have been investigating number facts within 10. They have been recording their findings in a variety of practical ways and also formally as number sentences e.g.  $7 + 3 = 10$ ,  $6 + 4 = 10$  and so on.

Year 2 have been using their number bond knowledge to recognise related facts using multiples of ten. If we know that  $2+8=10$ , we also know that  $20+80=100$ ,  $80+20=100$ ,  $100=20+80$ ,  $100=80+20$  and more. From this we problem solved to recognise patterns when adding and subtracting multiples of 10.

There was an enthusiastic turn out for cross country on Tuesday. If your child would like to join, pop into the office for a form to fill in. All children who take part must also have another pair of clean trainers or plimsolls for our indoor P.E. sessions on Tuesdays and Fridays each week. **They also need a plastic bag or other appropriate shoe bag for their muddy cross country footwear.**

We will not be setting any homework over the half term holiday other than reading as much as possible and spelling revision.

**Indoor P.E. will continue to take place every Tuesday and Friday after half term.**

Your child should have brought their P.E. kit home for a wash today. Please note that they will need their kit on the first day back after the break (Tuesday November 5<sup>th</sup>) All children require shorts, a t-shirt and clean plimsolls or trainers for this.
