Things to note ...

- General information is available on the class page.
- If you are isolating or off for any other reason, there is a home learning section on the class page for you to follow along with what we are doing in school.
- Children should be reading three times a week at home, which they can record in their school diaries. Each read counts towards your child achieving a reading certificate.
- Homework should be completed in homework books to a 'Take Care' standard.

Homework for this week:

Spellings – Your children will have 15 spellings written down in their diaries or homework books to learn for this week. Each child has completely personal spelling lists. Once they have been tested, they write down the next set of words from the statutory spelling lists and any that they got wrong on that particular week. Spellings are tested each Friday.

Maths – Complete the worksheet focusing on line graphs. This is additional practice to go alongside what we have been working on in class.

English / Topic – How am I linked to World War 2? Same homework as last week – due Friday 3rd December.

Over the next 2 weeks we would like you to gather information about how you are linked to WW2. You might have had a great grandpa who was in the armed forces, or a great Aunt who was evacuated to Canada (some examples of stories so far from our class!). Your house may have a story behind it, of being built on an old air base which was used as a communications hub in WW2. You might have a family friend or elderly neighbour who lived through the war and has some great stories to share. We would like host in our classes, a living museum, where you bring in your research and information (and any memorabilia if you have permission) to share with the rest of UKS2 in 2 weeks time. Please make sure you get permission from adults if you are borrowing memorabilia or possessions to bring into school. We will take lots of photographs of our museum to put on to the website © Watch this space!
