


It was lovely to welcome everyone back to school this week — the children were full of excitement and news about their half term experiences. I really en joyed hearing and reading about the various activities they got up to. As always, we have a very busy and exciting half term ahead — so much to look forward to! I always think that this is the most en joyable half term in the school calendar for young children. There is the excitement of Diwali and Bonfire Night closely followed by our Children in Need charity day and then of course all that comes with the countdown to Christmas! If that's not enough, we have our wonderful new topic 'Moon Zoom'. Amongst a variety of activities, the children will learn all about the Solar System, create their own hanging mobiles of the planets and find out why July 20^{th} 1969 was a significant event in history. Our R.E. focus this half term will be around the celebration of Diwali and the meaning of Christmas.


Over the final week of last half term, we worked with clay and danced with an ex Strictly celebrity!! I was so impressed with the gargoyles and grotesques that were modelled out of clay, they looked as realistic as the ones we saw at St. John's Church during our visit to Perlethorpe recently. I am sure that your children told you all about the enjoyable session with Robin Windsor — he was full of energy and enthusiasm and managed to get everyone dancing and following his routines... even me!

Maths:

Year one have started a new unit on addition and subtraction where we have started to look at part whole models. The children know that two parts make one whole.



We have also learnt about the addition symbol and how to write a number sentence from a part whole model. The children have learnt how to write these in four different ways:



In year two maths, we are continuing with addition and subtraction over the coming weeks. The focus has been spotting patterns between number bonds of ten and then twenty to increase speed and fluency in addition and subtraction. We have also spent time noticing the link between number bonds to ten and number bonds to 100. The children have loved spotting the connections and patterns with number.

English:

We have been looking at a both harvest and firework poetry. This week, the children have really impressed me with their creativity with fireworks and bonfire night. The children have created some word banks with adjectives and nouns in that surround bonfire night. We have also acted our onomatopoeic words and have created our own calligram poems that look like a firework.

Homework:

We now have a new homework grid for our topic 'Moon Zoom' This will work in exactly the same way as last half term. Children can complete as much or as little as they are able to from the grid. Please only send the homework book into school on a Friday so that we can make sufficient time to look at it properly. As mentioned during our parents meeting conversations, we will also be sending maths activities to complete at home from time to time as and when it is appropriate.

Reading:

The children are continuing to impress me with their organisation and are remembering to bring their diaries into the classroom on Friday mornings to have their reading checked without me having to remind them! As always, all children with three or more pieces of reading evidence in their diary, will receive a sticker and a house point for their efforts. We are really trying to promote the importance of reading and develop a love for books at this early age. Thank you so much for your continued support with this.
