### Homework:

### Maths – due Monday 12<sup>th</sup> December

The children have been given a worksheet that focuses on adding and subtracting fractions. This is to consolidate what we have been learning in class this week.

### Geography project – due Monday 12<sup>th</sup> December

For homework we would like the children to produce an A-Z of environmental geography. The children need to find something out and about and either take a photo, cut a picture out or find something with the letter of the alphabet on and present it beautifully in a creative way, i.e. a picture of a wall for W and display in a lift the flap style. As the theme is environmental geography, we would like pupils to look at things in the natural world rather than random things in the home (so not z for zip! Good luck on that one!). Please can you make sure that this no bigger than A4 please. We would like this to be your most spectacular work ever as it is destined to go on a prominent display board in the main school. Mrs Plumb's daughter did a particular excellent A-Z a few years ago so she may be a good source of inspiration (Mrs Plumb that is). So key points –

- No bigger than A4
- They will need to be attached to a wall
- Natural examples from outside
- Best possible 'take care' work

In the past, we have had a London Eye with each pod having a different letter, flip books, pop up posters, a world with opening doors, Big Ben with different levels for each level, a roller coaster, haystack with opening doors, concertina book, pocket poster (each pocket having something in it), a double decker bus with window letters, Advent style calendar – the list has been endless, let your imagination and creativity run wild!
