Welcome to Year 6!

This term's topic — Dynamic Dynasties. . .

In Dynamic Dynasties, we'll learn about periods of ancient Chinese history, explore a timeline of the first five Chinese dynasties and learn about the legends surrounding the beginning of Chinese civilisation. We'll take a deep dive into the history of the Bronze Age Shang Dynasty and explore evidence found in the ancient city of Yin, study oracle bones, learn about religious beliefs, and explore bronze artefacts that set the Shang Dynasty apart from other civilisations. We'll also study the hierarchy of the Shang Dynasty and discover who was powerful and who was powerless, look at warfare and find out how bronze technology gave the Shang Dynasty an advantage over their enemies. We'll learn about the life of the great military leader, Fu Hao. We will then look at significant aspects of life after the Shang Dynasty, including the work of Confucius in the Zhou Dynasty, the short but significant reign of Emperor Qin Shi Huang of the Qin Dynasty and the importance of the Silk Road created by the Han Dynasty. To end the project, we'll find out how ancient China's lasting legacy can be seen in the world today.
