From this, we have focused on setting descriptions, where we have learned about adjectives, the 'pile of three' sentence structure, and prepositions. The children have worked so hard on these. We have already planned our own versions of the story, set in a snowy woodland, which we will be writing next week.

Reading at home:

Please aim to read with your child (at this time of year, reading lines from the nativity script is a very valuable reading activity) at least three times a week and continue to sign it in their diary. I will continue to be check diaries every Friday and will award stickers as a reward for regular reading.
