

I hope you all had an enjoyable half term. The children have been full of news and stories about what they got up to over the week!

For Year 2, we have spent the last couple of weeks preparing the children for their SATs, which have now become optional for all Year 2 children. The decision was made that all schools in the Aspire Trust would go ahead with these assessments, as it was felt that the outcomes would provide us with useful information moving forward. We completed the first two assessments this week. We have tried to keep the assessments as low-key and relaxed as possible for the children — they may not even realise they've completed them! I am very proud of each and every child in my class; they all performed to the very best of their ability, which is all we can ask! There will be two more assessments next week alongside the Year I Phonics Screening Check. This will be carried out one-to-one with me in a quiet space, where they will read a range of real and non-real words. I know I will be equally proud of the Year I children.

As we have been focusing on reading comprehension and phonics revision, the children will not be bring a book home this week as we have not read it in class together.

In R.E., our new topic is based around symbols and signs. The children discussed the meaning of some of the signs and symbols around us, including learning what our school badge means. They also felt that the most important symbol is a heart, focusing on love and kindness for others.

In science, we have been finishing our unit about animals. The children discussed the pets they have at home and found out more about how to look after them. Pets in our class included dogs, cats, fish, and even horses!

The children have loved our history learning and seeing how the world has changed since the Victorian era. We had a Victorian lesson this week where they had to curtsey or bow to the teacher, repeat everything twice, and have a go at Victorian handwriting.
