Feedback response:

Playtime space. Our House Captains are currently planning play zones in our playground(s).
 We have a right of way access through our playground which we must keep clear with no obstruction. It has been suggested we use the field more at break and lunchtimes:
 Supervision, safeguarding, toilets, being a public space, dogs/mess, time to take children up to the field and bring back onto school site... brings a challenge. However, we are looking at ways to maximise the space we have and use the public field where possible. The public field is used for outdoor PE and numerous sports activities across the year.

- School dinners. We are very proud of our school dinners. We have a 90%+ uptake currently.
 A three-weekly refreshed menu is being looked at alongside feedback from the children
 about their favourite meals. We appreciate we can't please everyone but we take great
 pride in our food motto, 'eat better, do better'. Please contact the school for any dietary
 requirements.
- Class sizes/structure. All our year groups are currently at different pupil numbers (some year groups below 30 and some over 40 children). As it stands, we have 88% in-catchment children/families. Each Year group can accommodate 42 children bringing our school capacity to just under 300, if we were at capacity in each year group. Being a village school, these numbers fluctuate each year and in-year. The fusing of certain year groups enables St Peter's to maintain a ratio of around or less than 30 children to one teacher. This is budget allowing moving forward. Socially, the children mix at break times, eat dinner as year groups, go on trips together. Exploring friendship groups, over time, in their St Peter's journey allows for a wider circle of friends. At Secondary school, we would hope the children's social ability to create new and lasting friendships, from being mixed with other children, would be a positive experience.
- Communication. Responses to this have been overwhelmingly positive. Our website is
 regularly updated and quality assured against Ofsted requirements. We hope you can find
 everything you are looking for on here. If you would like to see a particular section or a
 current section expanded on. Please let us know directly and specifically to see if we can
 consider your suggestion and meet this need. Emails, website links, parent weekly,
 Newsletters and text messages are used as a direct form of communication. If you do not
 receive messages/emails/text please let the office have an up to date number/email address
 to add to our system.
- Photos/safeguarding: This year we have had more requests to <u>not</u> have children on photos/in the Newsletter, etc. hence why it has been noticed by a handful of parents that we appear to have less photos on class pages of children, Newsletters, school Twitter...
- Payment for school activities/trips (myth). Activities and trips are costed to not make profit
 or account for non-payments. School makes up any shortfall. However, if certain trips are
 not afforded overall then it is unlikely they can be put on again in the future. We do not
 want to cancel enrichment experiences for children. We are certainly looking at future trips
 and residential trips for the children.
- Diversity, culture and wider society experiences. Currently, St Peter's buy into 'Picture News' which brings the wider world into our classrooms. Our PSHE scheme '1decision' supports childrens' personal, social, health, economic education. Our UKS2 children get to experience life in another school in London, with our partner school in Brixton. We hope this will be going ahead in the Summer term once again. Enrichment experiences have been a hit with the children at St Peter's; from Strictly Come Dancing visitor, the tallest man in Great Britain to in-school theatre visitors.
 - Assemblies promote our whole school *Take Care* values, with regular themes being: Diversity (promoted about embracing and celebrating uniqueness), treating each other with Respect, using kind words and actions, making everyone feel happy and welcome, our diversity makes us stronger, bullying, racism (recently UKS2 children all watched a BT Sports documentary about racism in sport (Football's Windrush story), include not exclude. Our behaviour policy: Ready Respectful Safe. Rev Ruth Colby takes a more religious assembly once a week.
- Teaching and learning. Again, this has been overwhelmingly positive overall with parents
 really appreciating what their child's teacher does with striving to deliver a fun, challenging
 and engaging curriculum. We are currently looking at different forms of feedback to parents
 on their child's learning and progress.

- However, if you feel you would like more information on your child's learning, class teachers can always be contacted to arrange a time to discuss your child's needs.
- Other comments: too much homework, not enough homework, can't think of any currently, earlier and clearer communications (often last minute), give parents more feedback on their child's education, greater use of apps to help with homework, healthier food, less sugar, homework set at a level the children can cope with as at times I think a little too much parental input is required, Keep being the best you can be.
 Less emphasis on SATs, improved outdoor provision, Limit the daily text messages from the school -very off putting emergency use only. More extracurricular activities for KS1 children. Smaller class sizes. More opportunities to challenge high achieving students, Take into consideration parents views and act upon them where they present a reasoned argument. Unsure to be honest. Continue the
