You could make this out of plasticine, junk materials or even with papier-mâché!</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Writing/Creative</p> <p>Choose a significant person to research. Draw or paint a detailed, 'take care' portrait and write down reasons for why they are significant.</p>															
<p style="text-align: center;">Research</p> <p>Write a short biography (an account of someone else's life) about a significant person who lived in the past. It can be someone we have found out about at school or even someone from your local area. Write about their life and why we remember them today. Share your biography with someone in your family and at school when you bring your homework book in. Don't forget to draw pictures too!</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Geography</p> <p>Hunt around your house and in your local area for memorials that celebrate the lives and achievements of important, significant people. Examples could include coins, stamps, statues, memorials or road names.</p> <p>Take photographs or draw pictures to share with us at school.</p>
