This week, we have had a fantastic time taking part in **British Science Week**, where we have been learning all about '**Changing and Adaptation**'. The children have been exploring how changes in the world around us happen and how living things adapt to these changes.

Using their own knowledge and any extra research, children should record how their chosen change can pose a risk to living things. They can present this in any way they like—a poster, a piece of artwork, a written explanation, an information leaflet, or any other format they prefer. The key aim is for them to understand and communicate how either **nature or humans impact our living world**.
