

Suffixes Spelling Homework

Year 3 Birch Class

This week spellings homework is putting into practice our understanding of **suffixes** which we have learnt this week in our No-nonsense spelling sessions.

A suffix is a letter or group of letters that goes on the end of a word and changes the word's meaning for example, crash into crashing.

Remember! When adding **-ing** or **-ed** you need to drop the 'e' and **double the consonant!**

For example, 'move' → moving / move

'stop' → stopping

Change each of the verbs in the table below into the past tense by adding -ed and then the present tense by adding -ing.

The first one has been done for you as an example.
