A suffix is a letter or group of letters that goes on the end of a word and changes the word's meaning for example, crash into crash inq.

Remember! When adding -ing or -ed you need to drop the 'e' and double the consonant!

Change each of the verbs in the table below into the past tense by adding -ed and then the present tense by adding -ing.

The first one has been done for you as an example.
