OUR CLASSROOM: • Water bottles are encouraged and children can drink from these whenever they feel like they need a drink in the classroom. These are filled up throughout the day from our (noisy) water machine! Each child has a class job which they are responsible for. • In our class we have 2 class bears (Eddie and Wilford). Wilford goes home with a different child each week and has a diary for the children to free write in, about their time spent with him. Eddie observes hard working children, those who are being 'Take Care', ready, respectful and safe, and nominates class members for Take Care Tokens. • Each half term we will endeavour to read 1 or 2 class books to the children. Our first book is Varjak Paw and the children are very engrossed already. • A fortnightly class newsletter is uploaded onto our class page of the website to let you know what we have been up to and which also lists any homework. HOMEWORK:

We will send work home if we feel it will support learning in class, for example a maths worksheet or topic research. Homework will always be detailed on our fortnightly newsletter which goes onto the website. The children should be encouraged and guided to go on Purplemash and other websites subscribed to by school (we will direct the children to which we would like them to use for the different pieces of homework). Finally, we strongly encourage daily reading from a variety of sources and regular practise of spellings and times tables. Year 4 children will be doing a National Times Table test in June which we will prepare for in school (more information to follow nearer the time).

SPELLINGS:

We are following the 'No Nonsense' spelling scheme and this will be taught during SPaG lessons or during a specific timetabled slot (usually Fridays). Individual spellings will be sent home as and when necessary. The statutory government spellings are included in the children's work diary and will be learned in addition to our in school spelling scheme.

WORK DIARY:

School diaries are to be bought into school every day. We use them to record reading and the children also use them as a supportive learning tool. We ask you (or your child) to fill in when they have read (to an adult or independently).

PE:

Outdoor PE will be on a Wednesday afternoon for all three classes, where they will mix and integrate with their peers. Appropriate clothing will be required for each session. For example: trainers and jogging bottoms and jumpers for outdoor and cold weather. Please ensure these (along with water bottles) are labelled.

Take Care Tokens, Integrity Awards and the Headteacher Newsletter:

Your child will know by now which house team they are in (this should be the same as their sibling). Take Care Tokens are rewarded for a variety of reasons (for example, good behaviour or outstanding work). Integrity awards are given for those children who go beyond everyday expectations. Take Care Tokens and Integrity Awards can be given by anyone - staff and parents, both in and out of school. Please let Mr. Tomlinson know if you wish to nominate a child.
