Thank you to everyone for helping with last week's homework. We are typing up our new words and generating a whole class dictionary. This year we will endeavour to increase our vocabulary and learn the meaning of words, to help develop our spelling and writing in general.

We have continued to study the book 'How to Train your Dragon' by Cressida Cowell in literacy this week and have completed a character study, along with SPaG work related to the text looking at pronouns -personal and possessive and the spelling suffix ous.

Our work on the Anglo-Saxons has been very productive and we have enjoyed finding out what a Historian is, who St. Bede is and why he is an important character. The children also enjoyed using the laptops to research everyday life of the Anglo-Saxons. They worked in pairs, recording their finds and sharing them with the rest of the class.

For homework, I would like the children to research Anglo-Saxon homes and villages. Can they find out what materials were used, how big they were, how the villages were organised and what other buildings were in the village?

STEM project

Next week, we shall begin to design an Anglo-Saxon home, ready to make a scaled down prototype in D&T. We shall link this to our maths; measuring, converting measurements, working out perimeters and scaling down. We shall use our knowledge of multiplying and dividing by 10's and 100's which we shall be developing next week.

Please continue to hear your child read and help them with their spellings and times tables. We had a very good success rate in this week's times table test!
