## Our Topics this week

English: Diary writing, prepositions and word groups

Maths: Place Value to 999 for Year 3 and 10,000 for Year 4

Topic: Science - Investigating Rocks, Music - Mamma Mia, ICT - Word processing

## **English**

This week we have continued to read The Firework Maker's Daughter and have written diary entries as if we were Lila. The children have worked hard on these and have today used the laptops to type up their draft copies whilst making amendments and improvements along the way. As part of our grammar sessions we have been learning/revising conjunctions, adverbs and prepositions. I have been challenging the children to use more exciting vocabulary and the children came up with some super sentences to describe myself and other members of the class.

In Spelling, we have been looking at suffixes and prefixes this week and how they can change the meaning of a word. Ask your child to see if they can remember which ones we have been learning about.

#### Maths

This week we have continued with our work on place value and have extended the learning to involve numbers up to 999 for Year 3 and beyond 10, 000 for Year 4. The children have used a number of methods to partition different numbers, including base 10, part-whole method and using place value cards. We have also worked on adding and taking away multiples of 10, 100 and 1000 even when the number has not started from zero. Towards the end of the week we focused on word

Towards the end of the week we focused on word problems and using our knowledge of the value of each digit to solve a range of problems.

In maths, next week we will be making times table fortune tellers so I am sure the children will want to show you how to make and use these at home.

Don't forget to keep practising the times tables at home.

## Reading at home

Well done to all the children who have made a super start on the reading challenge. I have counted this weeks reads this morning and some children are well on their way to earning their Bronze certificate!

Reading certificates will be given as follows;

Bronze - 25 reads, Silver - 50 reads, Gold - 100 reads.

Our PE days for this half term will be a Wednesday and a Friday. It is important that the children wear the correct kit on these days please. Hoodies and zip up jackets are not appropriate, school jumpers and cardigans must be worn instead.
