Our Topics this week

English : Biographies **Spelling** : Suffixes **Grammar** : Present Perfect Tense

Maths : Addition and Subtraction, Problem Solving - word problems

Topic: History - Roman Society, Life during the Roman Times, **Music** - Christmas Song practice, **ICT** - Purple Mash - Roman Mosaics, **PE** - Football and ball skills.

English

This week the children have been planning and writing their own biographies. The children did a great job of ensuring they included the correct features: Past tense, chronological order, third person, using headings and paragraphs, prepositions of time and co-ordinating conjunctions. In spelling we have been thinking about a range of suffixes and how the root word may change depending on the suffix being added. For example, when adding -ness to the end of happy you replace the y for an i. In Grammar this week we have been learning about the present perfect tense. This is another form of the past tense but is used when something has started in the past but may finish in the future. "Dad has made lasagne, for our dinner tonight."

Maths

In Maths this week we have been using the number line method as well as the column method to solve addition and subtraction problems. The children have found this tricky as when you use the number line method you start with the hundreds column first which is the opposite way to the column method. We have also been problem solving this week with word problems. The first thing the children need to do to solve these problems is to work out the maths that is asking you to do. We have spent some time looking at the language used within questions to help with this, for example, if it says "how many are left" it is likely to be a subtraction question.
