What is going on in the classroom?

English

The children have finished their work on Jack and the Beanstalk and we have been really happy with what they have produced. They worked really hard to think about who their main character could be, a description of the monster and how they could be defeated. During the hot write they focused on a description of either their main character or the monster. We were impressed with their use of adjectives and similes.

We have been looking at instructions this week based on 'How to Catch a ______'. They thought of their own mythical creatures and thought about how they could trap them in some way. We look forward to sharing some of their work with you.

Maths

During assessment week the children completed an arithmetic paper and a problem solving and reasoning paper. They all tried really hard and we were really impressed with the progress they have made. The types of questions they found tricky in the arithmetic paper were the balancing equations nes e.g a = b + c and a + b = c + d. These types of questions are extremely tricky but we will be using them as part of our starter

work during lessons. The children then moved on to learning about measuring, weight and capacity. They en joyed using non-standard measurements to weigh items, using the language heavier and lighter. They will be looking at capacity next week which will involve water!
