# 1st December 2023



This week we have been sharing stories that have an animal as the main character.

Our main story this week has been the Three Little Pigs and we have set up a new role play area in the old Reflection Room. This will now be a permanent role play area and will be changed according to the topics and the books that we are reading. Role playing is a very important part of story telling and this area allows the children to pretend to be a character without disturbing some of the quieter learning areas.

In Literacy we have been drawing our new story maps and changing some other parts of the story. We are starting to write simple sentences to go with these changes.

In maths this week, we have been looking at numbers 4 and 5. We have been finding these amounts, subitising and looking at I more and I less. We are also practising writing these numbers using the formation rhymes.

Next week we will continue to look at stories that have animals as the main character. We will also be doing our Nativity for an audience, so we hope to see you there!

In Literacy we will continue to innovate our Talk+Writing story to make their own versions.

In Maths we are continuing our work on numbers

1 - 5

Subitising, I more and I less and then looking at all the number bonds to 5. By the end of the year, the children should be able to rote say these bonds e.g. 4 + 1, 5 - 1 etc

## Reading books

We hope you are enjoying the books and reading with your child.

A few things to remember:

- Your child will have read the book several times before they come home, so they should be confident with the book. The aim of home reading is to give them some extra practise with an adult and enjoy the reading time with you. If the book is too tricky or you are having to help them a lot, then the book is not pitched correctly.
- Please write down the dates that you are reading with your child. Each time you read you can use a new box to record how you think the reading went.
