Curriculum:

We have been working hard in English following the Talk for Write format. We have looked at the features of a newspaper, practised interviewing each other and gathering eyewitness accounts. We shall cover a short unit on measure and area before moving onto multiplication and division, next half term.

In Geography we have been using 6-digit grid references and learning to use an atlas to find countries in North and South America.
