Cinderella wore glass slippers to the ball. Do you think these were the best shoes to wear? Investigate different materials she could have chosen and think about the pros and cons. For example, wellies are waterproof but not very easy to run in.

Can you compare the habitat of the Troll to the habitat of the Goats? Have a look at which type of animals live in your garden? Why do you think penguins couldn't live on grass?

Draw a map to show how Little Red Riding Hood got to her Grandmas house. Think about what or who she saw on the way.

# Once upon a time...

This project supports children to develop a love of stories and reading. It encourages children to learn, retell and act out familiar and traditional tales including *Cinderella*, *Goldilocks*, *Little Red Riding Hood*, *The Three Little Pigs* and *The Three Billy Goats Gruff*.

After the Three Little Pigs got rid of the big bad wolf they lived happily for a while. However, they decided that the house was too small for them. Can you create a new house for them? You could build it, draw it, paint it or however you would like to make one!

Little Red Riding Hood stopped to talk to the Big Bad Wolf, Talk to your grown ups about what to do if a stranger came to talk to you. What should Little Red Riding Hood have done instead?

Can you make some biscuits, as if you were going to your Grandma's house? You could take a picture to show the rest of the class how you decorated them.

Baby bear loves to sleep with his favourite teddy bear. Do you have a favourite teddy? Can you create a picture and label it with his or hers' name?

Listen to as many fairy tales as you can. Which fairy tale is your favourite and why? Can you have a go at re-telling the story but changing one thing about it? For example, *The Three Little Ducks*.

Can you think of how the pigs in *Three Little Pigs* are different to real pigs? Do you have any pictures of a real pig you could look at to help you?
