## **Child-Friendly Safeguarding and Child Protection Standard**

### **Feeling safe and happy at East Bridgford St Peter's C of E Primary Academy**

At St Peter's, we strive to take care of ourselves, each other, the world and with our work. As part of this we want to make sure that you feel looked after, safe and happy when you are in and out of school. Sometimes we don't know if something bad is happening, so you need to tell a trusted adult (in or outside of school) so that we can help.

This document explains how everyone at St Peter's help to take care of one another through something called 'Safeguarding and Child Protection'.

Child protection ensures that:

- Your health, welfare and safety are the most important things in school;
- All pupils are respected and kept safe;
- Pupils can make good progress in school work and feel happy;
- We teach you how to recognise risks in different situations and how to protect yourselves and stay safe.

### **How we help to keep you safe at St Peter's:**

- We provide a safe school environment for you to learn in.
- Our gates are locked during school hours and only approved visitors are allowed to come into school. You will know that a visitor has been approved if they are wearing a **RED visitor's lanyard** with visitor ID badge.
- All children know to not press our gate button. It is not their job to let anyone onto school site.
- All teachers and school staff have special training on how to keep you safe. Everyone who works at our school wears a lanyard and has an ID badge with their picture on.
- In our playground we carry first aid bags. We encourage you to take care in our walking and running areas. Be careful of the slight slope.
