**All Nottinghamshire Local Authority (LA) maintained schools and academies share a similar approach to meeting the needs of pupils with Special Educational Needs and Disability (SEND) and are supported by the LA to ensure that all pupils, regardless of their specific needs, make the best possible progress.**

All schools are supported to be as inclusive as possible, with the needs of pupils with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) being met in a mainstream setting wherever possible.

**The four broad areas of need are:**

- Cognition and Learning
- Social, Emotional and Mental Health Difficulties (SEMH)
- Communication and Interaction
- Sensory, Medical and Physical needs

**What is the local offer?**

- 'The Children and Families Bill' was made operational in September 2014. From this date Local Authorities and Schools are required to publish and keep under review information about services they expect to be available for the children and young people with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND), aged 0-25. This is the 'Local Offer'.
- The intention of the 'Local Offer' is to improve choice and transparency for families. It will also be an important resource for parents in understanding the range of services and provision in the local area.
