What is the local offer?

- 'The Children and Families Bill' became operational in September 2014.
 From this date Local Authorities and Schools were required to publish and
 keep under review information about services they expect to be available
 for the children and young people with Special Educational Needs and
 Disabilities (SEND), aged 0-25. This is the 'Local Offer'.
- The intention of the 'Local Offer' is to improve choice and transparency for families. It will also be an important resource for parents in understanding the range of services and provision in the local area.
