This week's other learning:

- Maths as well as keeping times tables ticking along, we have now reached the end of our most recent unit on multiplication and division and have also completed an end of unit assessment on this. Our next unit will be perimeter and area for a few weeks.
- English The children have loved our T4W unit on suspense stories. We have worked on a range of skills using our toolkit and are now ready to use their written structure to begin planning and writing their own versions based on 'The Nightmare man' over the next week or so.
- P.E. we are en joying both basketball skills and a range of outdoor cooperation activities, working in teams. Lots of children in both Year 5 and 6 have planned and delivered some warmup activities for the start of each lesson with amazing confidence — we will be out of a job soon!

- Geography We have been introduced to some new vocabulary in connection with modern day farming techniques.
