

# What have we been up to this week?

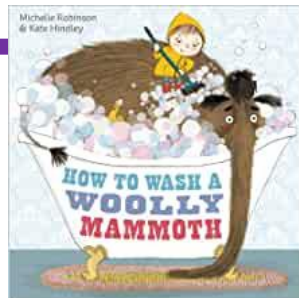


## General

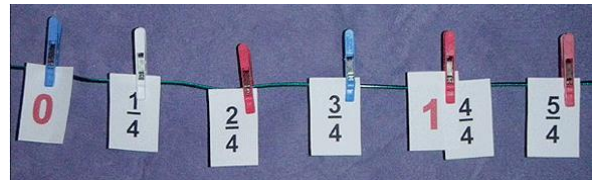
## English

In English we have been learning how to edit and improve our work using our purple polish pen. We read back our work to check for punctuation and to see whether we could include some more exciting detail. We looked at how to describe a setting using exciting vocabulary including adjectives, our senses and a simile. We also looked at how to use imperative verbs and rhetorical questions.



## Maths

In Maths this week we have been looking at non-unit fractions. This is when the numerator is larger than 1. We also looked at the equivalent fractions of  $\frac{1}{2}$  and  $\frac{2}{4}$ . We then focused on how to count in fractions.



## Topic

In our topic this week we have continued our learning on "Through the Ages". We looked at Celtic Warriors from the Iron age and different inventions from the Iron Age.
