## Learning Spotlight

In our topic bright lights and the big city, the children have been really engaged in their learning. They have enjoyed understanding what a capital city is and have drawn their own maps of London with key landmarks.

In art we have been continuing our topic of learning – Rain and sunrises. Here the children have been exploring different textured materials and have made their own collagraphy. These were good, and the children enjoyed using paint rollers to print their finished designs.

The children are also really enjoying computing at the minute. We have been learning how to successfully code using purple mash.

And in PE the children have been focusing on balance, coordination and dance. The children have been really enjoying the PE sessions, keep it up!

## Maths

In Maths we have been consolidating our learning of the topic place value. After completing a short assessment Mrs Lewis and Miss Horsfield are very happy with the children's place value knowledge. During this topic we learnt how to count forward and backwards from random numbers, practiced how to write numbers and learnt how to use a number line.

We are happy with their understanding and have now moved onto their next topic of learning, addition and subtraction.

## English

In English we have been looking at the story Katie in London. The children have been very engaged in their learning and have completed their work to high standards. As part of our innovation phase in our talk for writing the children created a change in their story, the change being that Katie visited a new place with a new character. The children loved this as we looked at exciting attractions, such as Harry Potter world, Hamleys and The National History Museum. Other activities within our talk for writing, included looking at adjectives to describe different London landmarks, and creating a story map of our story, before writing our final version.

The children's weekly reading and spelling list have now been sent home and out on our class page on our website. Thank you to everyone who has been busy practicing writing and reading these words. On our class page we have uploaded resources related to Little Wandle including the sounds they are focusing on, the spellings we are looking at and sentences they are reading.
