Continuing with our topic Bright lights and the Big city we have been further learning about our key city London. The children have become so knowledgeable about London, and they have been really interested in this topic which is great!

In art we have now finished our topic of Rain and sunrays and we have moved onto our Design and Technology topic of Taxi! Here the children will be designing, making and evaluating a taxi in small groups. We have already explored some key terms including wheels, chassis and axles. We can't wait to see the children's taxis take shape over the term.

Throughout our science topic of Seasonal change, we have been looking at what makes a good experiment. We had great fun creating windsocks last week, and this week we have been measuring temperature around the school using thermometers.

Maths

In Maths we have been looking at Place value within 50. Here we have been using our addition and subtraction knowledge to help complete number lines to 50, make groups and count in tens, and estimate on number lines. The children have worked very hard in maths and have produced some fantastic take care work. They have also completed maths lessons with practical and concrete resources. This has enabled the children to work on their problem-solving skills within maths.

Once we have finished our place value within 50 unit of work, we will shortly be moving onto our next math topic of learning - Length and Height. Here the children will be using objects to measure heights, compare heights and understand the units for measuring heights.

English

In English we have been learning more about London through the book of Paddington at the Palace. We have read the story and completed activities to check our understanding. Once our story was understood fully, we were able to alter the story, inventing our own version. Here the children created a new location that Paddington could visit. In doing so we have learnt lots of facts about some of the London landmarks including Tower Bridge, London Eye and Big Ben.

The children have also been creating persuasive posters exciting the reader to visit one of the London landmarks. They learnt to use imperative verbs to make their posters attract the reader's attention, along with their drawings.
