English


Topic

This week the children explored the taste, smell and texture of different foods. We wanted the children to think of different adjectives to describe these — for example — salty, fizzy, soft, hard, sweet etc. We then moved on to making our bread. One lesson we definitely learnt was not to over proof! The children watched the scene in Oliver Twist where they sing the song Food Glorious Food and we discussed whether it was fair or unfair for the children to receive gruel, whilst the adults got to ate luxurious food.



Maths

In Maths this week we have been looking at fractions and decimals. We began with counting in tenths and converting tenths into decimals. The children need to have a good understanding of place value in order to count in fractions. In Year 3, we introduce them to tenths.
