Living Streets: Walk to School Week

Walk to School Week happens in May. Over 1,000 schools and nearly 300,000 pupils walked to school for a whole week during the 2023 event.



Classes can work together to make as many active journeys as possible. Pupils can track their progress each day on the fun and interactive classroom wallchart. Individual activity diaries, daily stickers and end of week pupil rewards will complement this activity, reinforcing the benefits and keeping children engaged. Sustrans Week

Sustrans Big Walk and Wheel happens in March and is the UK's largest inter-school walking, wheeling, scooting and cycling challenge. It inspires pupils to make active journeys to school to improve air quality in their neighbourhood.

Cycle to School Week happens in September. This week-long event encourages families to try cycling and scooting to school. It's a great way to celebrate the huge benefits an active school run brings, including the positive impact it has on children's health and wellbeing, local air quality, and on carbon emissions.
