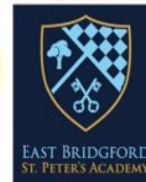

In Miss Walton's class children have been creating their own hoodies based on themselves.

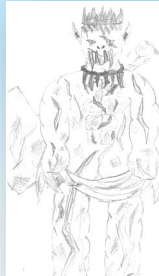
