Trips and Residential (overnight) trips

At St Peter's we strongly feel that residential experiences and day trips can play an important role in a child's learning and growing during their time here. The confidence element alone can be significant in a child's development.

Moving forward, and in a response to cost of living concerns and the significant increase in the cost of these trips, future residential overnight stays and trips are being looked at for best value but without compromising on quality.

As it stands, overnight residential trips are currently only for three of our Year groups. For Year 2, which is a one overnight stay at Beaumanor Hall, with Year 1 children going for the day. The Year 4 residential is currently a two night / three day experience at Dukes Barn outward bound adventure centre. Our Year 6 residential is currently a two night / three day experience at Whitby and surrounding area.

Day trips are for all year groups or on occasion may just be for a particular Year group. We work out a payment cost which is fair and reasonable. If payments cannot be met we do ask parents/carers to contribute what they can. However, if a cost of a trip or residential is not cost effective overall for school we will have to reconsider which trips we rebook the next time. As always, any positive feedback regarding trips and residentials are welcomed.

In addition, I would like to highlight that staff do give up their own time to lead and accompany the children on residential experiences and are instrumental in organising these trips alongside the office team. Also, thank you to our parents who give up their time to accompany the children on these day trips and play an integral part in these trips going ahead.
