- Like Mindful Playground, once you have decided to come you stay till the end of lunchtime.

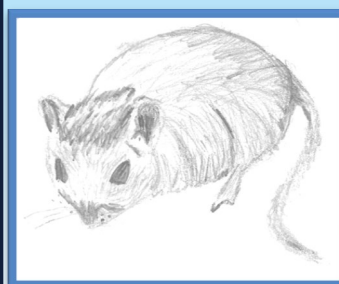
Who looks proud to wear their school uniform?

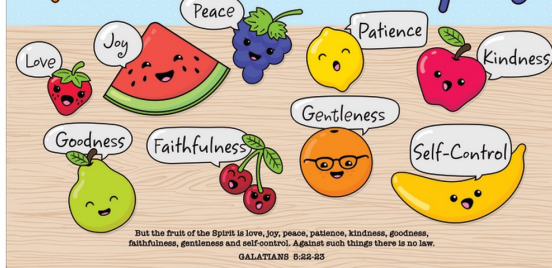
