Children are really enjoying the comics donated so far, if anyone has anymore, please send them in.

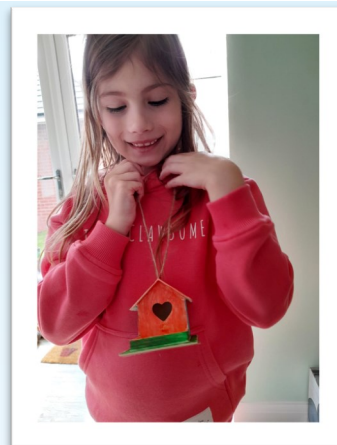
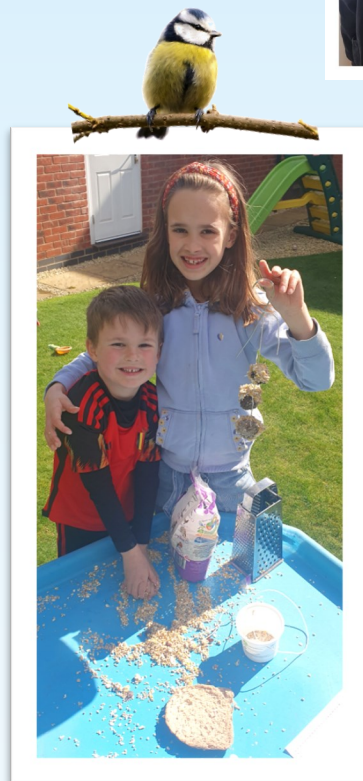

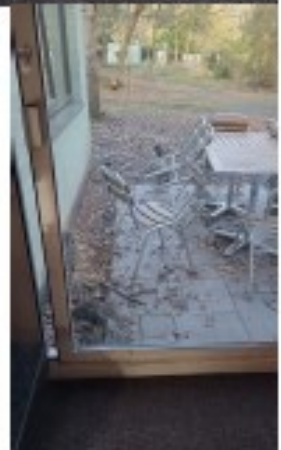
Luca put some of his bird food around the garden and in our bird feeder.

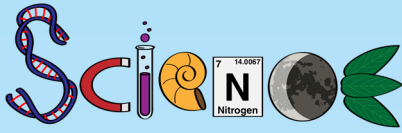


He spotted various different birds in the garden, the main one being black bird and pigeon. He also spotted a pheasant and a white owl flying over the field behind our house.

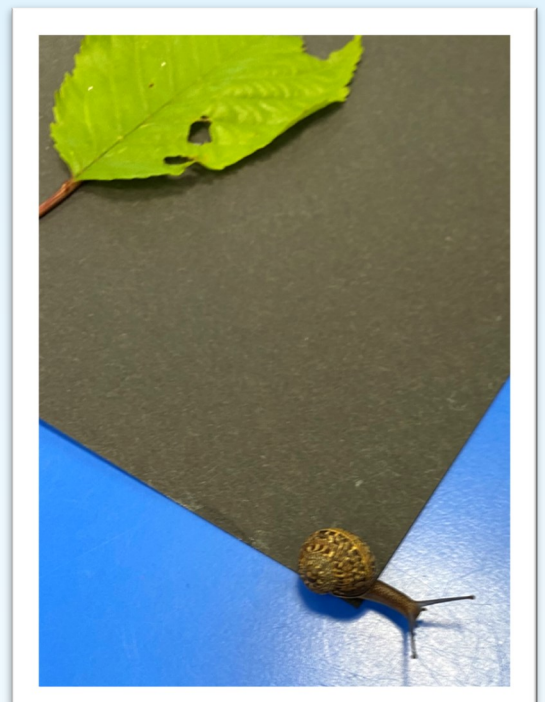
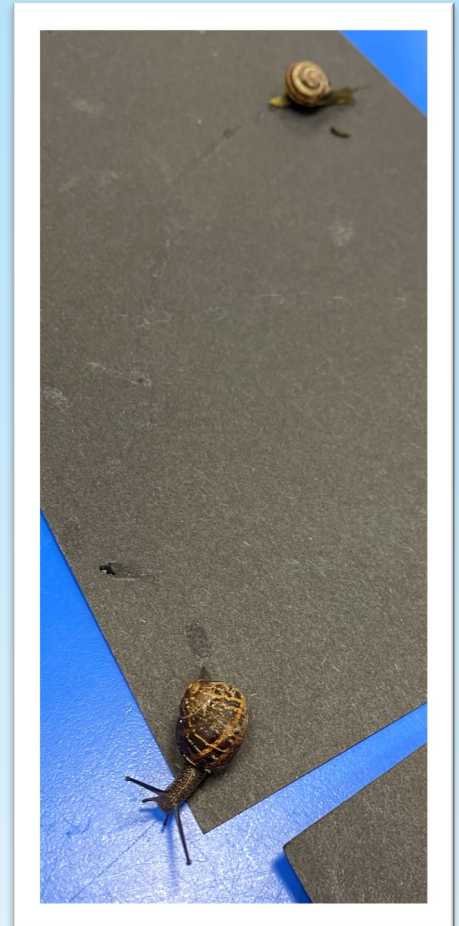


We also went to Centre Parcs a couple of weeks ago where Luca spotted various different birds and wildlife. He saw lots of ducks, goose and squirrels.

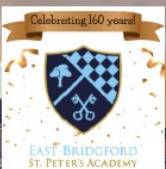
