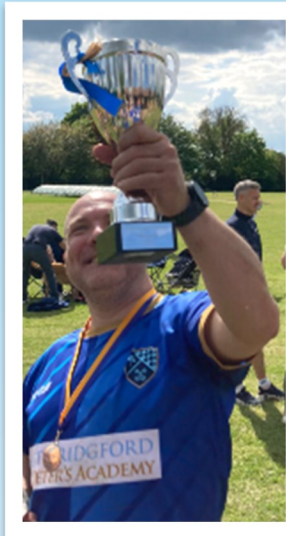

East Bridgford Dads lift the Eversheds Sutherland Cup

The eagerly anticipated clash of the titans took place last Sunday, as St Peter's Academy took on Willow Wanderers at Butts Field. The pitch was in fine condition after many nights of preparation by the St Peter's Dads, having passed a late pitch inspection on Saturday evening. The teams received a warm welcome as they entered the pitch, joined by the children of the players, to the sound of the Champions League music, rousing emotions amongst the players and the crowd.

The game kicked off to a frantic start. St Peter's stole the initiative with some incisive attacking play, resulting in an early penalty appeal as Martin Mitchell was brought down in the Wanderers' penalty box. The referee waved away the penalty appeals from the home side, much to the dismay of the St Peter's. The home crowd did not have long to wait to celebrate a goal as a few moments later, Ant Hogan broke the deadlock with a powerful far post header from an expertly delivered corner by Mitchell. Shortly after kick off Mitchell was back in the action again as a strong challenge from Wanderers was deemed illegal by the referee, resulting in him pointing to the spot. Mitchell dusted himself down and coolly slotted away the resulting penalty.

Wanderers started strongly after the restart and began to take a stranglehold of the midfield, with their years of experience on full display. Against the run of play, they were then caught out with another decisive counter-attack by St Peter's resulting in a further corner. A pinpoint delivery by Mitchell was met by Ade Cope whose looping header gave the goalkeeper no chance. Cue delirium amongst the home crowd.

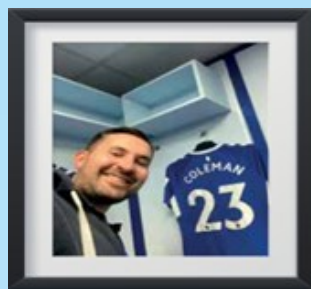
Again, Wanderers came out fighting, took control of the midfield and started to cause problems for the St Peter's defence. Both teams were pleased when the referee blew his whistle for half-time given the balmy temperatures.

The second half got underway with Wanderers continuing to dominate midfield without making many clear-cut chances, with the St Peter's defence of a combination of Duncan McPhee, Richard Povey, Steve Taylor, Mike Maguire and Alan McEwan standing firm. The few chances that Wanders did make were expertly repelled by Anthony Richards, with a man of the match performance in the St Peter's goal. St Peter's continued to look threatening on the break through Martin Mitchell, Ade Cope and Matt Buckley. Andy Allam brought some added impetus to the midfield to help break up Wanderers' play, complementing the tireless work of Stuart Turner-Haslam, Ant Hogan, Mark Fisher and Darren Abbott.

As Wanderers tired, St Peter's brought on more fresh legs in the form of Ollie King, Dean Wilmot, Andrew Goff and Michael Milner. The latter stole the headlines a few moments later as he rose like a salmon to meet an expert corner delivery from Andy Allam, to glance the ball into the back of the net with his first touch. With his work done, Milner made a swift exit to bask in his glory back on the substitutes bench. Moments later the referee blew his whistle and with that, the match was over. A great result for St Peters in their first 11 a side game against a resolute, ball playing Wanderers team. St Peter's lifted the trophy with celebrations going on long into the night. A great day for St Peter's.

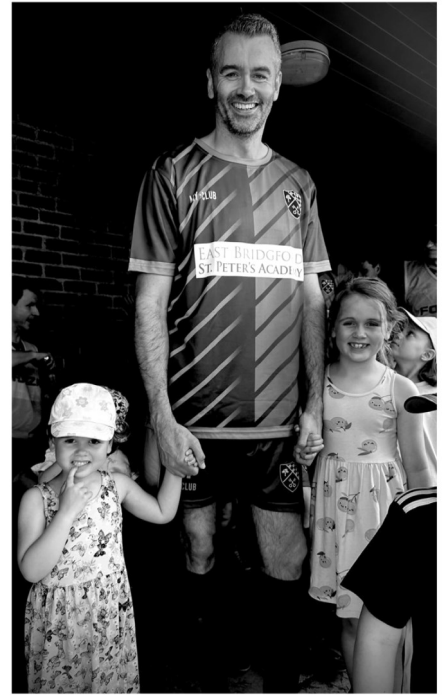

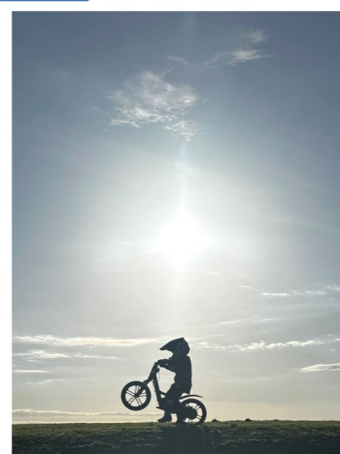
