Road Safety outside school

As you are aware, school traffic on Kneeton Road can be a rather busy place in the mornings and at home time.

I would like to say a huge thank you to those motorists and pedestrians who take care, consider where they park (if

driving is the only option) and make outside school as safe as possible.

Over time and more recently, we have had reported to school a handful of concerns regarding motorists: Parking/dropping off on yellow zig-zag lines, parking on pavements, not allowing the school bus through resulting in children being late into school or late to leave at the end of the day, even cars being scraped/damaged.

Our major concern is for the safety of the children!

The responsibility of safety to and from school remains with the parent/adult, not school.

As a school we can only request you are considerate, be take care, as children do what they see.

It is to this end, I have (again) requested Notts Council Council Traffic Enforcement team to come and observe the situation on Kneeton Road.

We welcome ideas and solutions from our local community to work together in the interest of safety for all. Previous ideas and solutions have been: park on my drive and walk offers, adjusting work patterns so parents can walk their child to school, car sharing, park further away and walk to school.
