The children absolutely loved it!

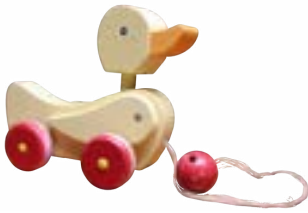

We're really proud of Charlotte for all of her hard work in swimming and passing Stage 5. Well done, Charlotte!

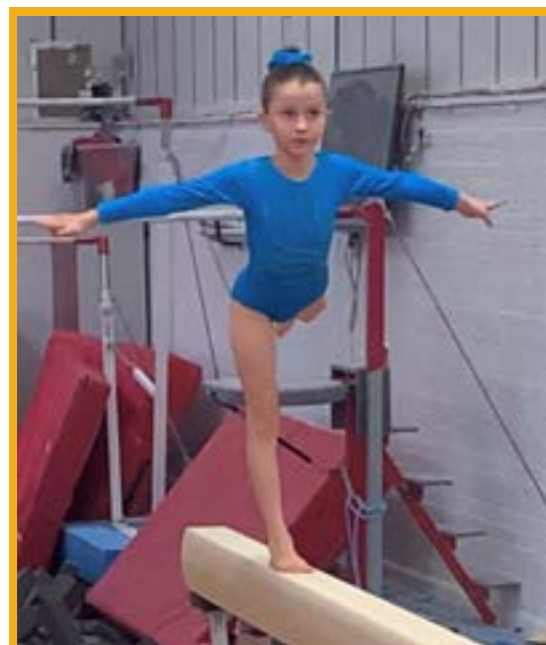


SWIMMING

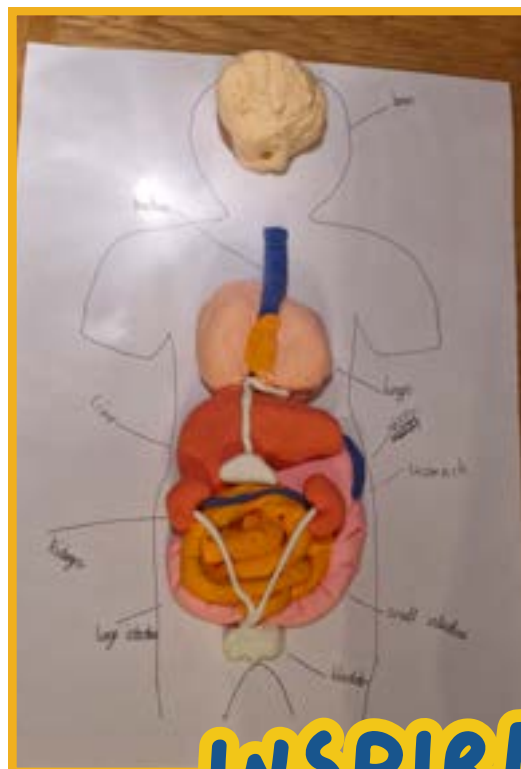
Good evening, hope this is ok to post on here.
