## FIR CLASS

Science Week Investigation -

Washing Peg Strength

As part of Science Week, Fir Class investigated the mechanisms and materials used in everyday washing pegs. The children explored different types of pegs and tested how strong they were by squeezing them and using them to hold socks. We added pebbles to see which pegs were the strongest - one was holding 50+ pebbles!

We discovered that:

Pegs with rubber inserts were the strongest and held objects most securely. Pegs without a metal spring were the weakest and struggled to grip items as well.



The spring mechanism plays an important role in how the peg works.

The children loved experimenting, making predictions, and comparing the results. It was a fantastic way to learn about forces, materials, and simple mechanisms in a fun and practical way! ⭐

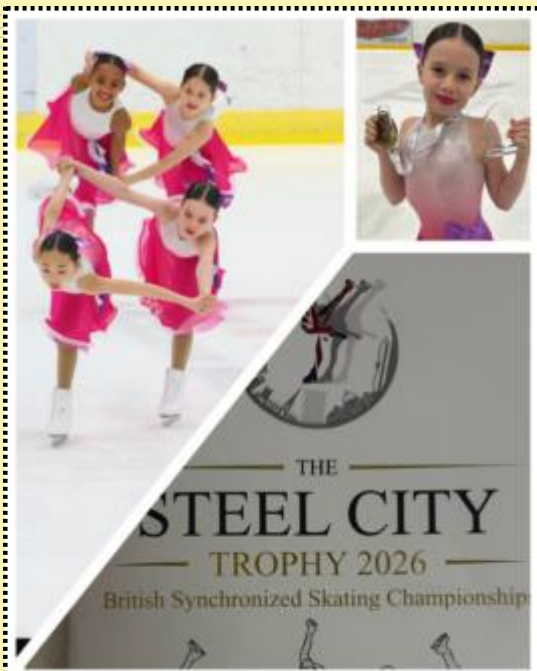

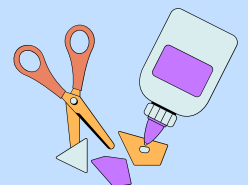
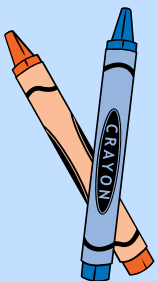
