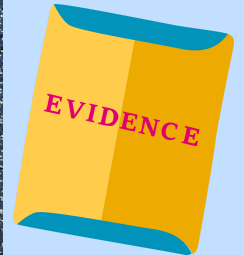




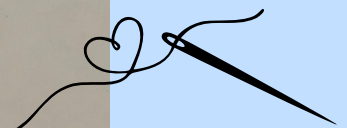
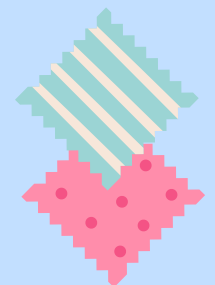
FIR CLASS

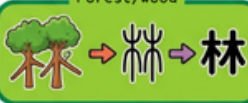

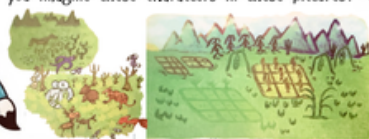

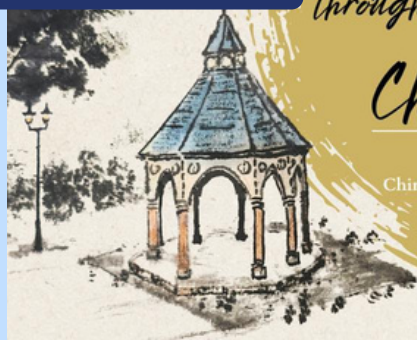
